Small tripod



A tripod is one of the first smartphone photography accessories you buy when getting into this art. It is a simple tool that doesn't need to cost much but will offer

many shooting benefits. The Manfrotto Pixi Evo (shown above) is one of our favorites.

A tripod can be used for long exposure photography when the [shutter speed](#) is slowed down. This technique can create light trails, smooth out fluids, and better expose images without increasing the [ISO](#) (which affects photo quality). Using a tripod can also reduce motion blur or shaky videos. It helps to have the camera static when learning composition, giving you more time and freedom to frame a scene properly.



I am a fan of large, sturdy tripods because I also use them for my heavy [DSLR](#) and [mirrorless](#) cameras. This is why we like the Joby Gorillapod 3K, which is a hybrid with excellent portability and sturdiness. It can be used for smartphones and much heavier cameras as heavy as three kilos. Octopus tripods get their nickname from their flexible legs. They can be folded and adjusted in multiple ways and can be used to wrap around objects.

Microfiber cleaning cloth



These are cheap and useful smartphone photography accessories. Smartphones get dirty and oily, including the camera glass. This results in blurry or smudgy photos, so make sure to keep the lens glass clean with a [microfiber cleaning cloth](#) — using your shirt isn't a good idea. We like this Nikon one because it comes in a little bag that's easy to carry and attach to other items, such as backpacks.

Remote shutter control



Save for a few exceptions, a smartphone's rear camera is significantly better than the one in the front. Taking a selfie with the rear shooter is no easy feat, though, and it's no fun having to rush for a timer. You can get yourself a remote shutter control to avoid the hassles and get the best selfie your phone can produce. These work via Bluetooth and allow the user to trigger the shutter from a distance.

Remote shutter controls also happen to be very cheap. A good one is the Ashutb camera shutter control. It works via Bluetooth with both Android and iOS devices. The 60ft range is extensive, and battery life is very generous with a six-month standby time.

Portable LED panel



Photography is all about light, and having some extra help in dark environments will allow you to get better results. LED panels have gotten smaller and more affordable. The one shown above is the Viltrox LED Lighting Kit and features a 3,000mAh rechargeable battery, temperature calibration, and dimming support. You also get a mini tripod and a smartphone holder for smartphone convenience.

Portable battery pack



Your phone will quickly run out of battery if you shoot photos and videos throughout the day. You don't want a dead phone when a photo opportunity presents itself. Getting a portable power bank to keep your phone juiced up is a good idea.

What makes it a more exciting option is its 10W wireless charging support. It's also very resistant to drops and other forms of tortures, just like all other Otterbox products.

Smartphone microphone



Audio is one area where smartphones usually lack quality, and it is crucial for recording video. Improve your clips by using an external microphone. A good one is the Rode VideoMic Me (pictured above). This directional microphone will be great for recording your voice, or you can turn it around to get better audio of whatever you're shooting. It can be attached to your phone's 3.5mm headset jack. If your phone lacks a headset jack, there's also a [USB-C version](#) available, as well as a [Lightning one](#).

Camera rig



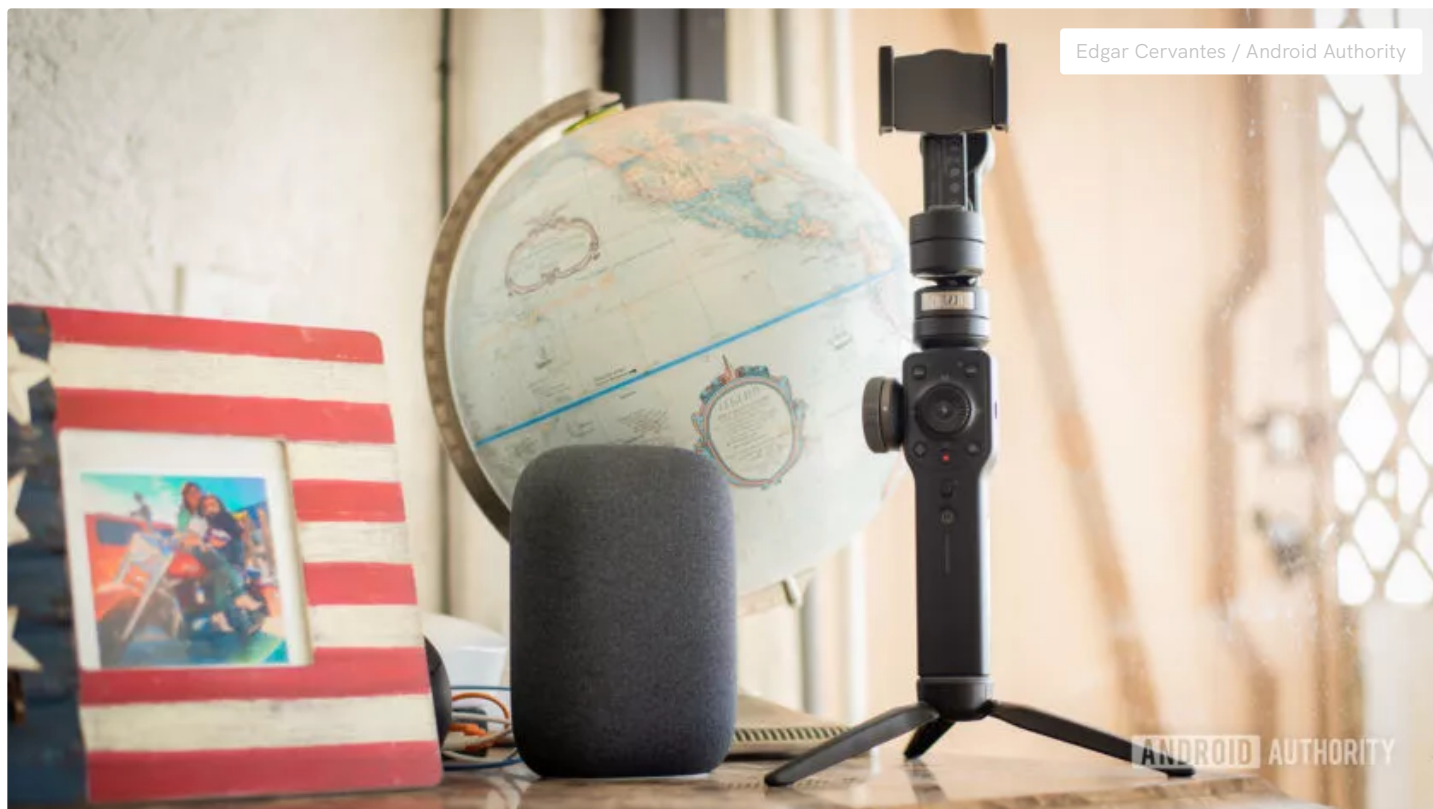

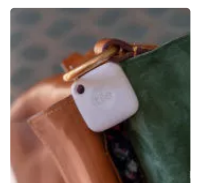
